Mathematics	4 years
Natural/Physical Sciences (two years must be lab-based)	3 years
Social Sciences (at least one year of U.S. or World History)	3 years
World/Foreign Language (check specific college req.)	1 year (2 yrs. recommended)
Academic Electives	2 years
